Campsite

With eighteen camping sites Bentley Copse has locations suitable for groups both large and small. Five buildings provide you options to run a camp supported by an indoor space for accommodation, catering, or storage.

Our position in the Surrey Hills makes us an ideal base for backpacking expeditions and Duke of Edinburgh at bronze or silver level.



Activity Centre

Over thirty engaging activities can enhance your program. Our self led activities are run by your own group, or our qualified instructors lead our more adventurous activities. Talk to us if you're interested in volunteering opportunities.



Training

Parker Lodge is a well equipped training building and sits at the heart of our provision. Be it a course for adults or a skill training for young people, we can provide a location for your training needs as well as delivering our own training courses:

Site Rules



Do not drive into the woodland or on the field

Unloading must take place in the car park. You are not permitted to drive onto your woodland site, or onto any of our camping areas.

Speak to the duty manager on the closest drop-off point possible for heavy equipment. It may be possible to temporarily unload from our access track.



All-Quiet : 10pm to 7am

Noise outside of these hours must be kept to an absolute minimum to not disturb others.



No dogs

Dogs are not allowed on site. Ensure parents dropping off or collecting young persons do not bring dogs with them when walking around site.



Respectful and safe behaviour

Your group must be respectful to others on site, and to campsite facilities:

- Do not disturb other groups or walk through their camping space.
- Monitor the behaviour of young persons.
- Be mindful that even well-behaved groups have found humour in deliberately making a mess – *Throwing wet toilet paper around the washrooms is a common occurrence.*



Clean as you go – Double check as you depart

Rubbish will get dropped accidentally – *sometimes deliberately*. Sweeps for rubbish. Groups staying with us on expeditions may require additional monitoring to ensure that rubbish is disposed of correctly, and not abandoned across the site or in the toilets – *Unfortunately a common occurrence.*

Arrival Process



Step 1 : Check your travel route

Cars, minibuses, vans and trailers are fine - Coach directions are available on our website – there is only one accessible route and the roads are very narrow. **Do not attempt to travel by coach without first arranging with us.**

Those hiking to site are **not allowed to enter or depart via Hound House Road on foot.**



Step 2 : Park considerately

Park *End-in* to the wooden barriers. Do not block gates. Assist parents to park considerately during drop-off and collection times.



Step 3 : Check-In

You must check-in with us upon arrival. Reception is often staffed 9am to 5pm. Call **07563 044 832** to speak to the duty manager if reception is closed.



Step 3 : Verify where you're camping

The invoice you have been emailed will contain your camping location – *While rare - This may change before arrival.*

There is also a map and list of reserved sites and accommodation buildings posted weekly outside reception. You may use the map there to identify your pitch.



Step 4 : Do not drive into the woodland or on the field



You are not permitted to drive to your woodland site, or onto any of our camping areas.



It may be possible to pre-book a tow for your trailer.



Step 5 : Unload using equipment trolleys

You should park in one of our car-parks and unload using our trolleys .

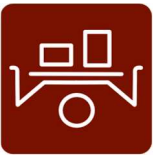
If you wish to move a vehicle closer to your site, do not do so without talking to the duty manager on **07563 044 832.**

Setting Up Camp



Camp Layout

Field and woodland sites allow flexibility in camp layout. Ensure you do not block paths and emergency vehicle access to sites. The tree-line marks the boundary of your camping area – please be considerate to your neighbours if making use of adjoining tree-lines.



Loading and unloading

Remember you are **not** permitted to drive onto your site to unload or load. Equipment trolleys may be used to move equipment to and from the car park. Return all trolleys to the trolley store to allow their use by other groups.



Building access

If you have booked a building, you will need the keys to access it. Call the duty manager on **07563 044 832** if reception is closed.



Marquee Access

Our marquees are locations you can hire for your use. They cannot be used without having them included as part of your booking.



Badgers!

All food must be stored in badger and rodent proof containers. Badgers will enter tents, they will eat your stash of cream eggs!



Freezer Shed

Our freezer shed is operational from spring until late summer – *or by arrangement outside of these times.*

The freezer shed contains:

- Fridge
- Freezer
- Chest Freezer
- Ice Packs

Departure Process



Step 1 : Clean

Hired buildings must be returned clean and tidy, following the instructions and check-lists provided.

Camping areas should be clear of all litter, food waste, altar fires and unburned fire-wood.

In the event of facilities being left unclean, cleaning fees will be charged at £25 per hour. All damages are charged at the cost of repair or replacement.



Step 2 : Check the toilets and washrooms

Do a sweep for lost property and litter. Vandalism to have our facilities, such as having a wet toilet paper fight, has become very common – even from young age scouting groups. Please do be vigilant and assist us by clearing up such deliberate mess.



Step 3 : Check the washing up area

Do a sweep for lost property, litter, and pasta clogged plugholes!



Step 2 : Know your camping numbers

So we may invoice you correctly, total up the number of adults camping, young persons camping and day visitors



Step 3 : Check-out

Standard check-out time is **4pm or earlier**.

You must check-out with us on departure. Reception is often staffed 9am to 5pm. Call **07563 044 832** to speak to the duty manager if reception is closed.



Step 4 : Invoiced after departure

You will be invoiced after you depart.

Toilets and Showers



Toilets

Our main toilet block by the car park is open throughout the year. Our *Top Toilet Block*, on the outside of Little Lodge is open during busier periods.

Other than those inside hired buildings our toilet facilities are accessible by all visitors.

The code of the adult toilets in the main toilet block is included in your booking confirmation email.

We have twelve showers across our two blocks. Our showers can see significant demand during hot and busy weekends.

Adults and Young Persons

Adults may not use the young persons washrooms. Young persons may not enter the adult washrooms, even if accompanying a parent.



Family Camps / Baby Changing

We recommend that those holding family camps at Bentley Copse hire *Palmer House* to support their stay. This will provide them a male and female washroom suitable for family use.

A baby changing station is in the *Top Toilet Block* accessible toilet.

Dishwashing & Water Disposal



Dishwashing sinks

We have three large dishwashing troughs on the outside of the *Main Toilet Block*. These are reserved for dishwashing only.

You may never wash dishes in the washroom basins



Campsite dishwashing

You may wash dishes on your camping pitch – *Please provide your own bowls and tables / washing stands for this.*

All waste water should be poured down the dishwashing sinks to ensure it is treated correctly – please do not dispose of anywhere else.



Washing Up Liquid / Cleaning Products

You must provide your own cleaning products.



Chemical usage

Strong cleaning products such as bleach and oven cleaner – **may not be used at Bentley Copse**. Doing so will damage our waste water treatment systems.



Washing up bowls

We provide bowls for your convenience. Please reserve for washing up dishes, clean them and return immediately after use.



Environmental impact

Our high capacity hot waster system is powered by propane. Please improve our carbon footprint by teaching your young persons to wash up efficiently:

- Rinse in cold water.
- Make efficient use of water – *All water is metered*
- Never just wash up under a running tap – use the washing up bowls.
- Wash up the cleaner items first!

Waste Disposal



Rubbish

Our large blue Dumpy Bins located in the car park should be used for all your catering recycling and waste.

At peak times we will aim to position bins on the *Camping Field* and adjacent to the *Main Toilet Block*.



Flatten packaging

Please flatten all packaging and boxes. Our bins can become 'full' at peak times, and this is invariably because the lower half is cardboard boxes that haven't collapsed.



Take your damaged equipment home

Our mixed recycling bins cannot be used for damaged equipment. Once an item such as a tent, chair or sleeping bag has reached the end of its life – please take it home to dispose of.



Heavy waste

Please be aware of the total amount of waste you are creating as we are charged by the kilo.



Chemical toilets

We have no disposal point for chemical toilets. Waste from chemical toilets cannot be disposed of at Bentley Copse as it will damage our on site sewage treatment plant – killing all the digestive bacteria.



Gas Cylinders

Gas cylinders, empty or otherwise, cannot be disposed of at Bentley Copse. Please take them home.



Waste at dishwashing sinks

Dispose of all food waste in the blue dumpy bins before washing dishes.

Open Fires



Open fires and barbeques

Unless affected by a drought ban, managed open fires are allowed across the site. You may use our altar fires, bring your own or use one of our designated locations for ground fires.



Ground fires / Campfire circles

You may book our large campfire circle. Our smaller circle in the *Training Area* to the south of the site is available to use by request and not in use by those booking *Parker Lodge*, *Little Lodge*, or the *Training Area*.

Concrete bases for ground fires are available on sites 12 and 13 and within the *Training Area* woodland.



Altar fires

1. Collect from, and **return** to the store near the rifle range
2. Use a sheet of corrugated iron beneath them when using them on grass.
3. These are not bookable, so please share them considerately with other groups.



Wood pile / Wood sources

1. Our woodpile stock varies in the season.
2. You can collect wood across the site from any ground source.
3. You may not cut down any tree / branches.
4. You may wish to bring your own sources of wood if our wood pile is low.



Ash disposal

Unburned wood should be returned to the woodpile.

Ashes should be doused with water and disposed of in the Ash Pit next to the rifle range.

Fire Safety

1. Fire points are available across the site:
 - a. On the North side of the *Site Office* by reception.
 - b. On the East side of *The Merrow Building* facing the field.
 - c. On the North side of *Palmer House* facing the grass camping area.
 - d. On the North side of *Little Lodge* facing the campfire circle.
2. Small fires should be at least five meters from tents, buildings, trees, or other flammable materials. Increase this distance for campfires. All fires should be kept off-ground unless at a dedicated campfire circle, or concrete fire base.
3. Fires should be kept to the minimum size possible. *This improves air quality and preserves the site wood supply.*
4. Fire extinguishers or full water buckets should be kept close at hand.
5. Fires should never be left unattended.
6. Cool ashes should be disposed of in the *Ash Pit*.
7. Follow safe practices when sawing / preparing wood – Only manual tools are permitted on site. No chain saws / reciprocating saws / circular saws.



Safety



Group safety

Your visiting group holds responsibility for the safety of all persons in their group, including during drop-off and collection. Please ensure all adults are familiar with our documentation. You will be acting *[In loco parentis](#)* to the young persons in your group.



Accidents, incidents and near miss policy

Please do refer to our procedures or speak to the duty manager regarding any issues.

Hiking / Road safety

Our driveway entrance from Hound House Road **cannot** be used by those arriving on foot. Our South West bridleway gate should be used and is always unlocked.



Hound House Road is an extremely narrow and fast single track road. There are no pavements or verges – just steep walls on each side. It is not possible to over emphasis how unsuitable and dangerous it is to navigate on foot.

Expedition leaders must ensure their groups avoid Hound House Road and arrive / depart via our bridleway gate.

Activities



Instructor led activities

We have a wide selection of adventurous activities that are led by our instructors. Groups of ten work best, twelve is the maximum for a standard session.



Self led activities

These are managed and led by the adults in your group. We have a selection of fixed activity compounds (EG pedal karts) as well as activities that can be used across the site.



Preparing the group

1. Get the group ready for the activity 5 to 10 minutes early.
2. Ensure they are dressed for the conditions, with closed toed shoes.



Group leader preparation

1. Read the activity operating instructions for self-led sessions.
2. Read the activity risk assessment.
3. Collect the self-led equipment and/or keys.
4. Arrive at the activity location 5 to 10 minutes early.



First Aid / In loco parentis

There must be an adult group leader accompanying each group of young person participants to an activity. This adult will be acting [In loco parentis](#) to the young persons in their group.

Group leaders must have access to a first aid kit.

For instructor led activities, group leaders and other accompanying adults must ensure the young persons exhibit good behaviour and are following the directions of the activity instructor.

Frequently Asked Questions

Barbecues (Can we bring our own?) : Yes, or we have a 6' commercial BBQ for hire.

Bedding (Do you supply it?) : No, our buildings do not come with bedding, nor do we have it available to hire.

Birthday Parties / Private Bookings (Do you?) : Yes offer private bookings and parties.

Campervans (Can we sleep in them?) : Yes, but not on your camping pitch – only in the car parks.

Drones (Can we fly?) : Sorry, it is not permitted to fly drones at Bentley Copse

Doctors Surgery (Where is the nearest?) : Shere Surgery & Dispensary, Gomshall Ln, GU5 9DR, 01483 202066

Gates (Will they be open?) : The hikers entrance from the bridleway is always unlocked.

Hospital (Where is the nearest A&E?) : Royal Surrey Guildford, Egerton Road, GU2 7XX

Music (Can we play?) : Yes, but be very considerate to other groups.

Shop (When does it open?) : We can often open the shop at the time of your choosing – there are not set hours.

Shelter Building (Are there materials?) : Building natural shelters is difficult due to the lack of resources. We recommend you build tarp shelters.

Tables & Benches (Do you hire?) : Yes, please enquire.

Tree Climbing / Rope Swings (Allowed?) : No, please do not build rope swings or allow climbing of our trees.

Own Instructor (Can we use our own activity instructors?) : Yes, if arranged in advance.

Power Hookups (Do you offer?) : Yes, but only in certain locations.

Site Staff (Where are they?) : If the office is locked and you can't find us, call or WhatsApp 07563 044 832.

Site Service Work (Do you offer?) : Yes we can accommodate your group for site service volunteering, contact us to make arrangements.

Supermarkets (Where is the nearest?) : There is a small co-op in Shere, or a larger Sainsburys or co-op in Cranleigh. Guildford has several large supermarkets.

Supermarket Deliveries (Do they?) : Yes supermarkets will happily deliver. Meet them in the car park.

Tomahawk (Own range?) : Yes you can setup your own range following your own risk-assessment. Confirm your chosen location with us to avoid disrupting other groups.

Woodpile (Is it well stocked?) : It's very seasonal, at times you have to forage for dead fall and prepare your firewood.

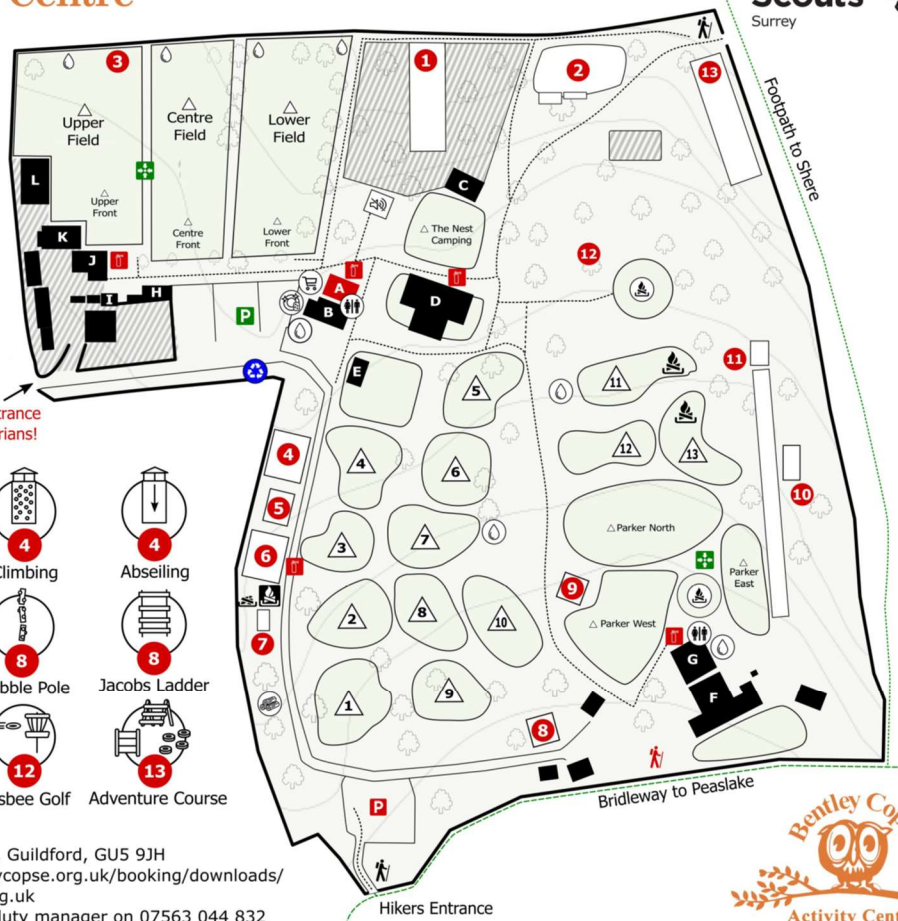
